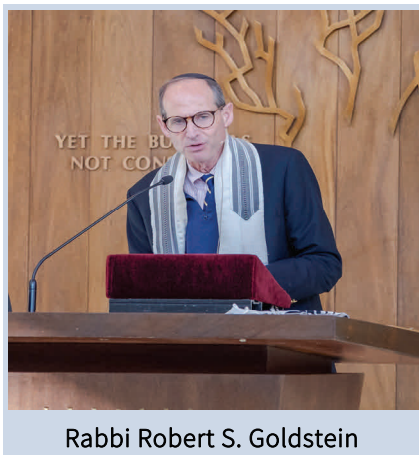

Recently I was sifting through some pictures from our Temple archives in anticipation of our centennial celebration. I found photographs of Confirmation classes dating back to the 1930s, a picture of students at a Model Seder from the early '60s when the Temple was still located on Tower Hill in Lawrence, and one very sweet photo from the 1940s of students dressed in their Purim costumes, wearing aluminum foil crowns and felt robes. One photo that caught my eye was taken on Oct. 30, 1978, at the groundbreaking for our present home on Haggetts Pond Road. I recognized a number of the people in the picture, many of whom have since passed away.



There must have been an early cold snap that year since everyone was bundled up against the weather. The land on which the Temple now sits was a stark windswept field with trees lining the perimeter. In spite of the weather and the barrenness of the site, one could see the excitement on

the faces of the many congregants and town officials who gathered for the ceremony.

I found myself wondering what that intrepid group was thinking. While there was clearly a feeling of joy and pride, I suspect there was also a certain amount of apprehension. I heard that while much of the money for the new building had already been raised, a substantial shortfall remained.

Breaking ground on a new building was a bold step for the hundred or so people who stood in that empty field. What they may have lacked in funds, they made up for in enthusiasm and faith in their ability to overcome any obstacles that would come their way. While the journey was not always an easy one for that determined group of our predecessors, they met the challenges with an unyielding confidence

in the worthiness of their mission. Forty years later, we are the beneficiaries of their courage, their vision and their dream of establishing a strong and vibrant Jewish presence in Andover. Now it is our responsibility to secure the continued strength, vitality and vibrancy of our congregation.

As I have watched our Temple evolve over these last three decades with a constant stream of new and committed leadership emerging, I know that our generation has the capacity and the will to pay tribute to the legacy of those who came before us by doing our part.



This new year, 2020, will be an exciting time as we honor the memory of the founders, celebrate all that we have accomplished in the last century, and create our own vision for the future of our thriving congregation.

MUSIC AT TEMPLE EMANUEL



The High Holidays' services were uplifting, unique and extra emotional this year. After leading services with Rabbi Goldstein for so many years, it is hard to believe that this was our last one together. I will miss our services' planning, collaboration and friendship, especially during the Holidays. There were so many devoted congregants who worked hard and donated their time, effort and talent to make the Holidays so meaningful. I would like to take this opportunity and thank them all.

"Kibbutz Galuyot" is a biblical term that literally means the "Gathering of Israel." The State of Israel is known as a Kibbutz Galuyot, a state that is gathering Jews from around the world. Being a Kibbutz Galuyot state highlights the variety of culture, food and character Israel has to offer. Jews who moved to Israel brought with them their old countries' culture and helped to create and shape the culture of Israel. In music, the merging of Kibbutz Galuyot is interesting and a unique one. In addition to the folk music that Sephardic, Ashkenazic,

Yemenite, Ethiopians and other Jewish communities contributed to the cultural growth of Israel, a traditional Jewish element is added to the mix as well. Traditional Jewish music may include Biblical Tropes (such as Torah and Haftarah chanting), klezmer music which is a reflection of the Nusach (the folk melody of the synagogue/service; a melody that is depending on when the service is being

conducted), or "MiSinai Tunes" (literally chants we received at the Sinai's Revelation; many of the High Holy Days' melodies are considered "MiSinai Tunes"). The Kibbutz Galuyot of Israeli music is rich, diverse and fascinating. I am excited and honored to be invited by the Cultural Climate Committee at West Elementary School in Andover, to give a lecture/performance on Israeli Culture and Music on November 14th at the school's auditorium.

Another opportunity to showcase our "Kibbutz Galuyot" music and performers is at our annual Chanukah Night of Music on December 13th. All our talented in-house musicians and singers participate; preschool and Hebrew school choruses, the Soul Sisters and the Abbas. I am looking forward to celebrating with you all. Happy Festival of Lights and music!

Board Meeting 9/9/19
Previous Minutes: Approved

Campaign:

Andi Pollinger gave an update on the Campaign for the Generations for the temple's 100th Anniversary. We are in the midst of our public launch. Susie Novick has become the campaign chair since Marc Freedman became temple president. Susie will focus on donor stewardship and relationship building. We crossed the \$1.2 million mark this week.

Naming opportunities - Some naming opportunities for donors have been taken. High profile naming opportunities still remain for classrooms, the kitchen, the rabbi's study and the office suite. We will coordinate how we recognize those names, which will happen later in the process. People have to reach a threshold in paying for their donation before we put up their plaque.

How board members can help: Be an ambassador and champion for the campaign, share ideas and info, reach out, mention the campaign at committee sponsored events, think big.

Education: Preschool opened last week and religious school started yesterday. Everything is

going really well.

Rabbi Search: The committee is made up of a diverse group of congregants to reflect our community. The fact finding subcommittee conducted surveys and focus groups to develop our application. The application was submitted. The transition subcommittee is working on a sendoff for Rabbi Goldstein on 6/12/20. His family will be there, guest speakers, and there will be a large oneg in a tent. We need to make sure everything is coordinated - if your group or committee is planning something for the Rabbi or Faith, please let Amy Riemer know. We are putting together a tribute book to offset the cost of the farewell event on 6/12 and something special for Rabbi and Faith.

The temple has a new driveway. A temple member donated 50% of the cost of the repaving. We reconfigured handicap parking so the crosswalk leads to a ramp.

High Holiday security - The Andover police chief assured us that the police detail during services will be mandatory so an officer will be here for every service and the town will pay the cost.

A HOME GUIDE FOR CHANUKAH

THE STORY OF CHANUKAH

In the year 168 B.C.E. (Before the Common Era), the Greco-Syrians, under the leadership of King Antiochus IV, ordered the end of all Jewish ritual as it had been practiced for generations. The Jews were shocked and distressed to think that their Temple worship, so much a part of their lives, would come to an end. They did not want to worship pagan gods, nor bow down to idols; neither did they want their Holy Temple profaned.

In Modin, a small country village, there lived a man by the name of Mattathias. He was a devoted Jew and he taught his five sons the importance of living according to the tenets of Judaism. They could not stand by idly as their Temple was being destroyed, nor could they allow the end of the Jewish people.

Judah, one of the five sons, was a brilliant strategist. Joining with his equally devoted brothers, and a small army, he was able to wage a three-year battle, overcoming the much better equipped Greco-Syrian army.

At last, on the 25th day of Kislev, in the year 165 B.C.E., they were successful in pushing out the Greco-Syrian army, and they immediately reclaimed the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. Unfortunately, it had been terribly overrun - defiled and defamed. They quickly cleaned the Temple, restoring it to its original beauty.

In ancient times, Jews would come from all over Israel to worship on various holidays. Sukkot, which is an eight-day holiday that falls in October, had not yet been celebrated that year because of the Greco-Syrians' control of the Temple. After the Temple was cleansed that December (the 25th of Kislev), the people celebrated Sukkot (an October holiday) in December. The following year the Sukkot holiday was celebrated back at its original time in October. But now in December there was a new eight-day holiday. For eight days the Jews everywhere would celebrate *Chanukah*, to remember the miracle of a small group of ill-equipped Jews who were able to overcome a greater and stronger army.

THE LEGEND OF THE OIL

There is also a legend which tells of an incident that happened when the Jews finally reached the Holy Temple. Their task was to light the *Ner Tamid* (the eternal light which still hangs over the Ark in every synagogue) that had been allowed to burn out during the Greco-Syrian occupation. They were only able to find enough special oil to last one day, even though it would take eight days to get more of the special oil needed for the lamp. Miraculously, the oil lasted for eight days, giving them enough time to get more oil!

KINDLING THE CHANUKAH LIGHTS

The *menorah* or *chanukiah* symbolizes the religious freedom for which our people have always fought. The flickering lights remind us of the constant struggle, not only for our own religious liberty, but for all people's struggle for freedom.

Each night at sunset, the candles on the *chanukiah* are lit. The candles are added one each night, from the right to the left. They are lit (using the *shamash*) from left to right. It is a custom to put the *chanukiah* in the window, so that all will be reminded of the great miracle of Chanukah. On Shabbat during Chanukah, the *chanukiah* is lit first, followed by the Sabbath candles.

It is a custom to gather the family together around the menorah (*chanukiah*). The *mitzvah* of lighting the candles should be rotated

among the members of the family so that each member has an opportunity to light the *chanukiah* on at least one of the eight nights.

On the first night, the *sh'heh'cheh'yanu* prayer is said. It is also a tradition to sing "Maoz Tzur" ("Rock of Ages") following the lighting of the candles on each of the eight nights.

THE BLESSINGS

(The candles are placed in the Menorah from right to left, and lit from left to right.)

Blessed is the Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, who hallows us with his mitzvot, and commands us to kindle the Chanukah lights.

THE DREIDEL

The most popular of all Chanukah games is dreidel. The word comes from the German "dreihen" or to spin, which refers to the "turnover" of events when Judah the Maccabee was able to overcome the unlikely odds, and retake the Holy Temple. There is a tradition that during the time the Jews were forbidden from studying Jewish texts, they played "dreidel" while orally discussing the Talmud. If they were discovered, the dreidel game was a great cover! The letters on the top (nun, gimmel, hey, shin) refer to the statement, *Nes gadol hayah sham*, "a great miracle happened there." The dreidel is spun by the players, and according to what letter comes out on top, the participants either take out or put in Chanukah gelt (coins).

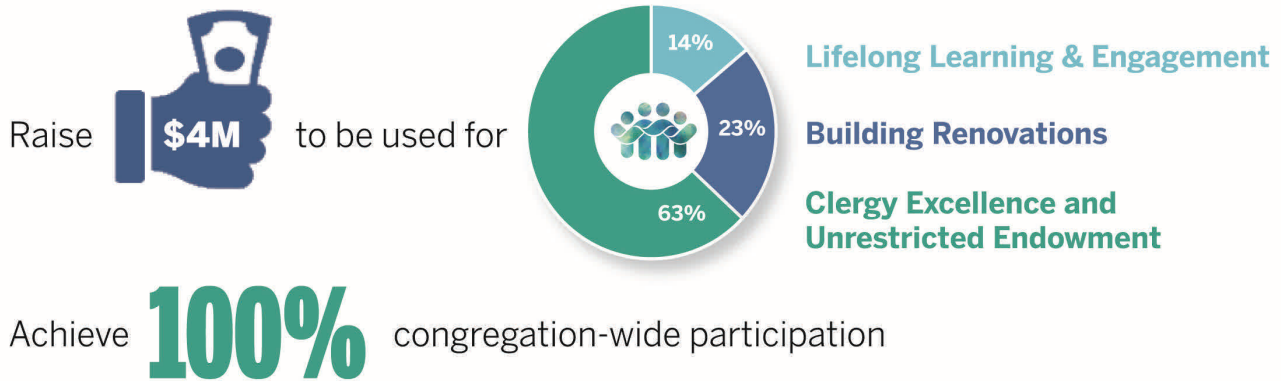

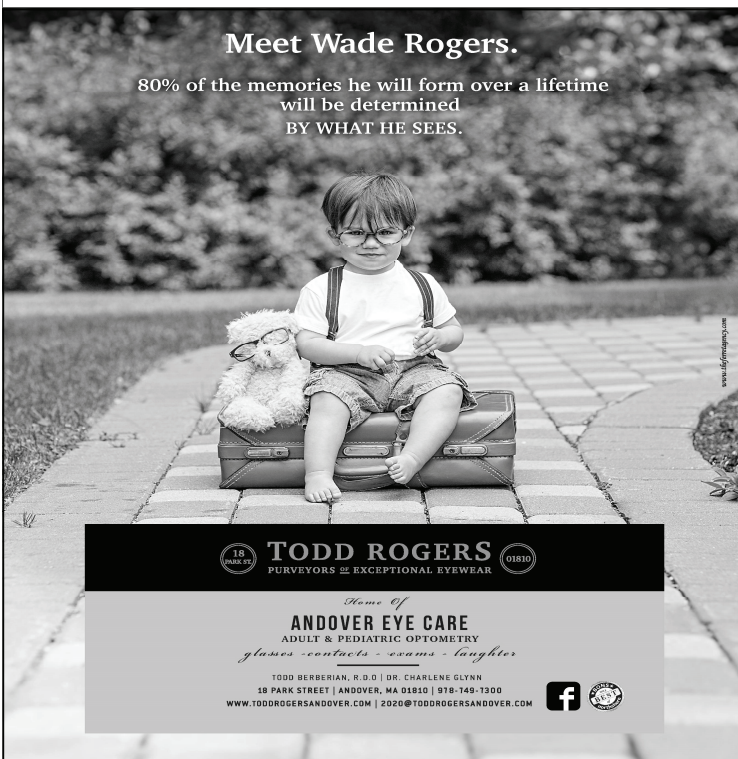

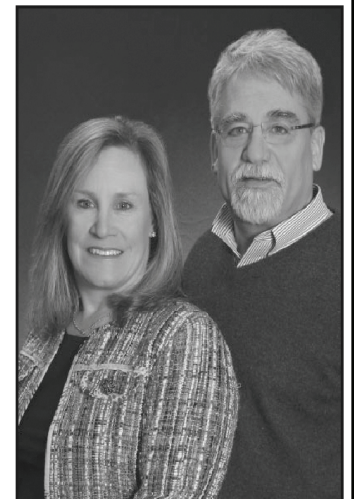
