I am admittedly a Luddite, not particularly savvy when it comes to technology. Before Covid-19, I was hardly aware of Zoom. Over the past few months, I have learned to conduct Zoom bar mitzvahs, Zoom Bible classes, and sadly, some Zoom shivas. Most gratifying is the number of people who attend our Friday night Zoom services each week. We have families separated by geography worshipping together; many Temple members who usually can't make it to services are joining in from their homes. Necessity has caused us to create a vibrant and warm virtual community, one we never could have imagined before the pandemic.

The late British historian Arnold Toynbee cynically branded Judaism a "fossil" religion, a faith whose time had long since passed. What he failed to recognize was the most obvious reason for its continued relevance: Judaism has never rejected modernity. Jewish rituals have never been completely static or fixed. While many traditions have remained unchanged, others have evolved over time.

The experience of the pandemic is a perfect example of how, forced to use

modern technology, we have discovered new ways to deepen our spiritual experience. As you know, this year's High Holy Days will be virtual. Though different from the years past, I have no doubt they will be deeply meaningful and spiritually uplifting.

Last March, on the very first Friday that we were "virtual", we began a new ritual which

we have continued at each of our Shabbat services. We end our worship each week by lighting Shabbat candles together. It is a stirring sight to witness the glow of hundreds of Shabbat candles, glimmering in the many Zoom frames. We become one community, physically separated but united by a spirit of Shabbat holiness.

When a vaccine is found and the pandemic is finally under control, we will take these lessons and use them to enrich our Jewish experience. And like the generations before us, we will use these new and innovative approaches to open the doors of our Temple even wider as we become an even more inclusive and welcoming community.

As the New Year approaches, we all pray for good health, for ourselves, for those we love and for those throughout the world.

Stay safe and healthy, and I look forward to celebrating the quickly approaching holidays with you.

A Message From Our President

I'm also pleased to announce that our Preschool will open as planned in September. Significant modifications, safety precautions and protocols have been initiated to insure both our teachers and students can learn and play in a safe environment. Parents have embraced our plan, and enrollment remains on-track for the upcoming season.

Later this month, you'll learn about plans to re-ignite our 100th Anniversary Campaign. We're closing in on our \$2Million Goal, and what better time to step up and express your belief that Temple Emanuel needs to remain the home for Jewish Life in the Merrimack Valley for another 100 years.

This fall we will also welcome our Rabbinic Intern, Sam Weiss. Sam grew up in our congregation and is the son of Jeff and Gerri (past president) Weiss. He will join us for the High Holy Days as well as several different services and programs throughout the year.

Introducing our Rabbinic Intern

Sam Weiss is a third-year rabbinical student at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York City.

Sam grew up in Andover, MA and graduated from the University of California, Berkeley with a BA in Rhetoric. During his time at HUC-JIR, Sam has worked in a variety of educational and pastoral capacities. At the URJ Kutz Camp for teen leaders, he designed and taught an immersive text-study experience that centered around *Machloket L'shem Shamayim*, the rabbinic concept of "Disagreement for the Sake of Heaven".

In New York City, he has delivered sermons across denominational divides, from Beth Am-The People's Temple in Washington Heights (Reform) to The Stanton Street Shul in the Lower East Side (Modern Orthodox). Most recently, Sam worked as a chaplain intern at the Bellevue Hospital Center and at Dorot, an interfaith social service agency that works to reduce social isolation among older adults.

Sam is committed to a Judaism that is at once thoughtful and heartfelt, and is thrilled to have the opportunity to learn and pray with the Temple Emanuel community in the coming year.

Music

There is no secret that our lives have been greatly impacted by this current pandemic. These unprecedented, complicated times brought the best out of Temple Emanuel and unfolded the strength and unlimited capabilities of this community. Thanks to the gift of technology and especially to the Zoom platform, we managed to maintain as ordinary routine as possible and created meaningful programs and new experiences. On the musical side, I enjoy the daily song sessions. In these sessions of uplifting of spirits, we sing together songs of hope and healing as well as learn and discuss the positive messages behind the songs. Each night we end the session with a virtual group hug, sung to Debbie Freidman's rendition of the biblical Threefold Benediction.

The weekly "Shabbat with Cantor Idan" was so much fun. It was an amazing experience to celebrate Shabbat each week with so many preschoolers and their families on Zoom. I can't tell you how great it felt to watch the students' lips moving as they sang and welcomed Shabbat with our special friends, a Dinosaurs (song) and a Baby Shark (song)! We ended each session with the blessings for wine, bread (Challah) and Shabbat candles.

Our Friday night services are very successful and brings hundreds of congregants every week to join us on zoom and welcome Shabbat with songs, prose and the lighting of the Shabbat candles. The Zoom experience allows those who never had the chance to participate at our Minyan, the more traditional format of the Saturday morning services, to join our regular "minyaners" and to have a traditional taste of Shabbat.

B'nai Mitzvah students continue to meet with me regularly every week as we are now officiating full B'nai Mitzvah services through zoom! The response by the families' is incredibly positive. It is such an amazing and moving experience to watch the zoom screens of families from all over the country, who join and listen to the Torah chanting of a B'nai mitzvah, celebrating together this milestone.

The pandemic did not stop us a bit from being busy and creative and this is true to the High Holy Days' preparations as well. While it is impossible to predict what the next weeks and months will bring, given the current situation, adjustments to the services were needed to be taken. Since it is unlikely the choir will be able to safely rehearse and later participate in this year's High Holy Day services, we had to make a difficult decision and not to have the choir this year. Personally, I am extremely saddened by this unfortunate situation as our Temple choir adds so much to the sanctity and beauty of our services. Our wonderful soloist Gitit Shoval, pianist Brian Friedland, flutist Amir Milstein and cellist Yael Rubinshtein will return and join me on the bimah. I am also excited to prepare post B'nai Mitzvah students to chant for us the Torah portion for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. There is no doubt the High Holy Days will not be the same this year, but I promise you they will remain powerful, meaningful and spiritual.

A Community in Song

If you pass by my door or windows any evening around 7:30pm, you might hear me belting out the Beatles' "Let It Be," Leonard Cohen's "Hallelujah," Matisyahu's "One Day," Rick Recht's "Kobi's Lullaby," or especially "Refuah Sheleimah, Heal Us Now."

Although my off-key, warbling voice won't get me an invitation to join the Temple Choir or Soul Sisters, the nightly Zoom songfests led by Cantor Idan Irelander have made me realize during this difficult time of physical isolation how very fortunate I am to be part of the Temple Emanuel community. We raise our voices together, and I can see multiple generations of old and new friends. (Thankfully through the magic of technology, everyone but the Cantor is muted!)

We also learn while singing, as the Cantor explains the history and significance of the songs – who composed and sang them, and what meaning they carry for Jews, Israelis and the world. He puts the words on the screen, as well as translations for Hebrew songs, so we can sing along and understand what we're singing. Each night, he selects songs to reflect what is going on that day in the world, Israel and in our hearts. He greets each one of us as we

enter the Zoom room, and ends each session with the priestly benediction, a virtual hug, and a warm "lailah tov".

I've been a Temple Emanuel member for 45 years, my family has held three b'nai mitzvah and three weddings here, and my closest friends are Temple Emanuel members. Yet I have never felt more connected to this spiritual community. This is due to the wonderful technological knowledge and leadership of Maureen Chapman, Rabbi Goldstein's inspiring Bible study and Friday night Shabbat services, and of course, Cantor Idan.

A word about Shabbat – In the past, I've only attended Shabbat services when I've been observing a yahrzeit. But now, the Zoom Shabbat has become an important part of my week. Seeing hundreds of friends, here and nationwide, hearing Rabbi's timely words and Gitit Shoval's and Cantor's inspiring voices, and joining together to recite the Mourner's Kaddish, sing Kiddush and light candles – these mark the beginning of a weekly time for reflection and rest.

If you haven't experienced all that our temple has to offer, I encourage you to join the Zoom songfest, Shabbat services and all of the other creative programs. Thank you, Temple Emanuel, for being a beacon of light, hope and healing.


Interests include: Piano and Bass Guitar, having recently joined a band, downhill skiing and surfing at Salisbury Beach.

For my Bar Mitzvah project, I will be fundraising for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.





The Zoom Bar Mitzvah Experience

A Parent's Point of View

Watching my son Henry read from the Torah on the Bimah was something I had been looking forward to since he started Holiday Happenings. June 13, 2020 was the scheduled date. Before we knew it, Henry was practicing weekly with Cantor Idan and we were finalizing plans for a Bar Mitzvah Celebration. We were looking forward to an amazing morning at the Temple and an evening party at the Warrior Ice Arena. COVID-19 had other ideas.

When Massachusetts first shut down in March, we thought things would be back up and running in a few weeks. The Temple began postponing the Bar Mitzvahs. We began getting nervous. The Temple contacted us in early April and suggested we postpone. The new date was going to be July 24th. Everyone thought that the Temple would be open to the public by July. We had to redo everything. A couple of weeks after the decision to postpone had been made, Rabbi Goldstein reached out and asked if we (Jen, Henry and I) would be interested in a Zoom Bar Mitzvah. He mentioned that his daughter had been doing them at her Temple. The Rabbi clearly did not want to be outdone by his daughter (who knew Rabbis have rivalries?) and suggested we could do it on the original June 13th date.

Once Henry was on board, Jen and I decided to go for it. We felt honored that we were going to be the first Temple Emanuel Zoom Bar Mitzvah. Then the real fun began. We had to figure out how to conduct a Zoom Bar Mitzvah. The original plan was to have a full service via Zoom from home and then have a small follow up service in July so Henry could read from the Torah directly. We

knew from the start we wanted to have a virtual background of the Temple Sanctuary. That provided more drama than anything else in the process. We had to figure out how to get it to work on our various computer screens. Uh oh! Except for my computer at work, all of our various computers and devices didn't show the background properly. Turns out we needed a Green Screen.

A little over three weeks before the big day, Rabbi Goldstein reached out and asked if we would like to use a small Torah that he had. We were incredibly honored that the Rabbi was entrusting us with this precious item. We made arrangements to get it from the Temple. It was amazing that Henry would actually get to read from the Torah at home rather than from a prayer book.

Getting the Green Screen (which was actually blue) to work was no easy task. Jen and I kept trying different locations. We had to move it around and rearrange our lighting. By the time of the big day, we had it positioned perfectly. Rabbi Goldstein had been Zooming with Henry getting him ready and had met with us via Zoom to get our parent speech on track. He was very easy to work with. He also let us know we would do a practice Zoom to ensure everything went smoothly when it counted.

The run through went well. We ironed out the kinks. We saw how we looked on screen and even wore our suit jackets to ensure they looked okay with our background. We made arrangements for a Kiddush meal for us, the Rabbi (whose daughter apparently was very jealous of that), the Cantor and some family members. We arranged for a social distancing photographer to take pictures and ordered a pretty cool mini-cake for Henry. We were ready.

Outside of a few last-minute background issues, the day went smoothly. Henry did an amazing job. His Hebrew was flawless. Jen and I were incredibly proud of him. There were approximately two hundred people on our Zoom. People loved our background. My favorite was the person who asked what room Jen and I were in at the Temple because they did not recognize it (it was our living room). We pulled it off! The Zoom Bar Mitzvah was perfect even though it was not what we imagined when Henry started Holiday Happenings all those years ago.

The Point of View of the Bar Mitzvah

I was so excited the morning of June 13th even though we had to get up super early. We took pictures and Mom and Dad were getting everything ready. I was nervous. I hoped I wouldn't mess up and that everything on Zoom would work. I kept thinking to myself "please don't mess up". The Zoom started and I was ready to go. I was so focused on what I had to do that I really did not have time to reflect that I was not at Temple. In retrospect, the whole process was pretty easy thanks to the Rabbi, Cantor Idan and my parents. I am really grateful that they helped me adapt to a Zoom Bar Mitzvah.

Social Action

The Social Action Committee took on hunger as its theme for the past year. Our "Do One Thing to Fight World Hunger" event was a success. It has become clear that food insecurity is more prevalent than ever so the Social Action Committee will once again be working to help stamp out hunger.

Highlights of the year:

- * Temple Emanuel Cares Virtual Team for the Project Bread Virtual Walk for Hunger raised almost \$8,000.
- * "Do One Thing to Fight World Hunger" brought together dozens of Temple Members to hear about food insecurity from distinguished speakers. We also collected and delivered boxes of donated food to the Merrimack Valley Food Pantry.
- * The Care & Concern program sent meals from Grandma's Chicken Soup to congregants who lost an immediate family member.



The Sacred Partnership of the Three Legged Stool

In Judaism we often hear of the three legs of the stool. The legs being worship, acts of loving kindness, and learning. But I would like to offer a different view of this stool: Clergy, Staff and lay leaders. I have always felt that there was a need for collaboration among these three, but the challenges of the last few months have shown me the true sacredness of this partnership. Our clergy, staff and lay leaders have had to pivot on a dime to accommodate our ever changing landscape given the Covid-19 pandemic.

We have been forced to be nimble in our thinking. To be able to change a program on a moment's notice to fit the day's most recent challenge to remain timely and relevant. Programs and services that take weeks to plan may have to adjust with a day's notice. And roles of each person, whether it be clergy, staff or lay leaders, have shifted as we work to maximize our strengths. Even how we do the most mundane of things, must be re-examined and re-imagined.

If these three legs do not work together, or do not have trust, the stool will wobble and fall. Just as the three legs hold the stool steady, the collaboration on an ongoing basis among our clergy, staff and lay leaders has steadied our congregation through the most trying of times. The shared burden and the shared effort has allowed us to continue to reach more than 250 people on any given Friday during services, with many services reaching over 300. It has allowed us to create learning opportunities and programs to fit the needs of the congregation as it exists today. It has given us the ability to meet the challenges of the pandemic with a clear mind and strategic approach. Our Covid-19 Task force has been hard at work to devise a plan to re-open our building when it is safe, and the time is right. Though we may not be sure when that is, or if we will have to close our building again, I am confident that our three legged stool will put us on the best path to keep our community connected, while also keeping our community safe.

What was it like growing up in this congregation?

It was wonderful growing up at Temple Emanuel. I made lifelong friends, felt a strong sense of communal belonging and developed a sense of myself as a Jewish person. I have particularly fond memories of decorating the Sukkah and acquiring goldfish at the Purim carnival.

What made you want to become a Rabbi?

I had the idea to become a rabbi when I was very little. I always looked up to Rabbi Goldstein and thought that he had an interesting and unique job. Though I drifted from Jewish practice, I maintained an interest in the role that religion, art and culture play in people's lives. In my mid-twenties, I was beginning to reconnect with Judaism when the opportunity arose to travel to Israel with Rabbi Hannah Goldstein. All of the participants on the trip were at a moment of transition and uncertainty in their lives. I witnessed the power of our religious tradition, culture and history to offer grounding and support to those in search of answers. It dawned on me that if it was a rabbi's job to facilitate experiences like this one, then a rabbi is what I wanted to be.

What is the most challenging course you have to take?

Jewish History. Not only does it span thousands of years and much of the globe, but it can challenge some firmly held beliefs about who we are and where we come from. Jewish self-concept is based in a mixture of fact and fiction. We look to stories and legends for the spiritual truths, the sacred wisdom that they contain. It can be difficult to square the Jewish story, as we understand it through our experience, with the Jewish story, as told by academics and historians.

If you could go back in time, who is one person you would want to talk to?

I would want to talk to the Rabbi Moses ben Maimon (also known as Maimonides or the Rambam). He lived in the 11th century in North Africa and faced many of the same challenges that we face as Jews today. He authored many moving books and letters about how to deepen Jewish thought and spirituality as well as how to pursue unity and justice in the diaspora.

What is your favorite verse from the Tanach?

"Lo ba-shamayim hi..." [Torah] is not in the heavens, [...] neither is it beyond the sea, [...] no, the thing is very close to you, in your mouth and in your heart, to observe it." (Deuteronomy 30: 12-14)

How has Judaism shaped your view of the world?

Judaism has shaped my view of the world in many ways. One that is at the forefront of my mind these days is the Jewish obligation to fight for human freedom and flourishing. Over and over again, our scripture and our liturgy demand that we remember the exodus from Egypt. For me, the effect of this is twofold: one is to live a life of gratitude and appreciation for the many freedoms we enjoy. The other is to be attuned to seeing bondage where it persists, to feel compassion for those who are still unfree and to act deliberately in pursuit of a freer world for all.

What advice would you give to today's Jewish youth who are embarking on their Jewish Journey?

If it seems weird, try it! Nothing ventured, nothing gained. I am all for bending Judaism to fit your life. But sometimes it is worth bending your life to fit Judaism. There are so many wonderful ways to be Jewish, but all of them require a little searching. So step into something new, and give yourself the chance to discover who you are and where you stand.

Tzedakah: Helping the Community

Helping the World Breathe

Sarah Lerner, daughter of Marci and Seth Lerner of Andover, and a member of Temple Emanuel since preschool in the 1990s, has recently found herself another home-away-from-home community in Boston during COVID-19.



She spends her days working at Wayfair as part of the Data Architecture team, and recently completed her graduate degree at Babson, and many late nights and weekends as a volunteer VP of Fundraising and Business Development at The Ventilator Project (TVP).

TVP is a nonprofit with a mission to help the world breathe. They have created a low-cost, scalable, easy to use, ICU grade ventilator to address the needs of COVID-19 patients as well as existing and future ventilator shortages.

“Watching a community come together during a difficult time has given me the passion and inspiration to continue working hard. I have been so humbled by the generous donations of time, resources, knowledge and money to help our mission come to life,” she said.

As a founding member of TVP, Sarah has worn many hats to help organize manufacturing partnerships, fundraise, analyze cash flow and help onboard the many volunteers from the start. Today the organization is made up of about 250 volunteers from across the country, of which 40 have traveled to Seaport in order to work on-site at MassRobotics donated facility.

“While not everyone is an engineer, it’s amazing to see so many diverse backgrounds come together to pitch in, working insane hours for free, while many also juggle full time jobs, all laser focused to make an impact on the world” Lerner said.

After 5 iterations, AIRA, their ICU ventilator is wrapping up FDA Emergency Use Authorization testing, and once approved,

manufacturing will begin with TVP’s network of over 50 manufacturing partners across the country and several around the world. AIRA was designed to use components outside the medical supply chain in an effort to ensure scalability was possible and TVP was not adding further strain on the ecosystem. The Ventilator Project hopes to raise \$500K in the next month in order to pre-order components and expedite manufacturing by funding the first 100 ventilators to be donated to hospitals in need.

Unlike most ventilators on the market that range from \$25K-50K, AIRA was designed to cost under \$5K with the intent to reshape the medical technology industry and allow under-served communities to access life saving equipment.

Tyler Mantel, the Founder and President said, “It is not a question of if, but when. In the past ten years, we have seen SARS, MERS, H1N1, Ebola, and COVID-19. As we continue to urbanize, we will continue to increase the communicability of disease. Respiratory diseases are most likely to become pandemics due to the likelihood of aerosolized transmission. So much of the world has few, if any, ventilators in their countries. We cannot wait to bring life saving equipment to the world. We have to make it a priority now”



While there might be a lot of uncertainty in the current time, I hope this story brings optimism as it highlights what a community can do when coming together to lend a hand for the common good.

Bread and Roses

Bread & Roses’ dining room has been closed since the end of March, but its staff continues its heroic efforts to feed the increasing number of food-insecure people in the Merrimack Valley. #HeroAngelo is hard at work once again, logging many miles in their outreach van as they deliver food support to agencies and churches across the Merrimack Valley. Lawrence still struggles with the Covid-19 health crisis. One out of three residents are testing positive, and options for the homeless to shelter in place are few. Many local ports of sanctuary aren’t available - and homeless individuals and families - along with immigrants, seniors and those new to the system have been seeking resources. Several area agencies - including Lazarus House, People’s Pantry, Project Home Again, Community Giving Tree and ACT Lawrence - are working with Bread & Roses to fast track services to families and individuals in Lawrence in real time in partnership with area churches. Typically, a social worker is required to make service referrals.


