A few years before we moved to Andover, I was wandering through the woods not far from our family cottage in the Berkshires. I noticed a pine sapling poking through the rich mountain soil and decided to bring it home and plant it at our new house.

When we moved to Andover, I dug it up, wrapped its roots in burlap, and planted it in our new backyard.

Over the years, the roots sank deep into the earth. We moved to a new neighborhood; once more, I uprooted the tree and it followed us to our new home.

Thirty-one years ago this June, as we followed the moving truck up I-93 to Andover, it would be dishonest to say that I wasn't feeling anxious, intimidated by the prospect of leading such a large congregation. Would I live up to the expectations of the Search Committee that offered me the job? Could I possibly fill my predecessor's very large shoes?

We were lucky. I certainly made my share of mistakes, but there was never a moment that I didn't feel supported. Our extended Temple Emanuel family warmly welcomed us, and through the years strengthened us, and loved us in more ways than I could ever have imagined.

Ben Bag-Bag said: "Turn it over, and turn it over again, for all is within it. And look into it; And become gray and old therein; And do not move away from it, for you have no better portion than it. (Pirkei Avot 5:22)

For my final bulletin article as Temple Emanuel's

Rabbinic Intern, I couldn't help but leave you with the wisdom of Rabbi Ben Bag-Bag. Not only does Ben Bag-Bag have a spectacular name, he presents us with a unique and compelling way to distinguish the ordinary from the sacred. As you may have guessed, the "it" in Ben Bag-Bag's instruction to "turn it over, and turn it over again" is the Torah. He teaches that a source of wisdom as deep and enduring as the Torah requires ongoing and innovative interpretation. It cannot be observed from a distance; it must be grappled with, wrestled with, turned this way and that. What's more, every time we "turn" the Torah, we reveal something new. We make meaning, discover what's important in life, find out about the world, draw nearer to our communities and connect with our innermost selves. We catch glimpses of the sublime, see the mundane in a new light. It is this quality that makes the Torah a holy thing: the sense that "all is within it" despite the fact that its

Ben Bag-Bag said: "Turn it overover, and turn it overagain, for all is within it.words have, by and large, stayed the same for millennia.When we engage with Torah, the text springs to life. With fresh eyes, its timeless instruction is revealed to us anew.

Like Ben Bag-Bag's perennial return to the Torah, I cannot seem to stay away from Temple Emanuel. *From Red-Bird to Rabbinic Intern* (the working title of my memoir), I have "turned" the Temple again and again. And in this ongoing process of turning, I have found a sense of meaning and belonging that has only gotten deeper over the years. I know that I am not alone in this regard. The Temple has supported so many as they have endeavored to live well and live Jewishly in the Merrimack Valley. It is something solid but not static—we can rely on it to change as we do. It is, in this way, the Temple is a holy thing and a sacred space: one can "turn it over, and turn it over again, for all is within it."

I want to thank you all for allowing me to serve as your Rabbinic Intern. It was an honor and a privilege to return to Temple Emanuel in this capacity, particularly during such a strange and difficult year. I particularly wish to thank Rabbi Goldstein and Cantor Irelander for their mentorship and guidance. I will not soon forget what I have learned from them and from so many of you. May this summer be a joyful season of renewal for us all, and may you have a safe and meaningful return to the Temple in due course. Until next time!

Welcoming Rabbi Max Chaiken

Dear Temple Emanuel Community,

As the days grow longer, and the earth warms and blossoms, we are eagerly anticipating meeting you all in person later this summer. Hopefully, this bulletin finds you happy and healthy. I continue to be grateful for all the scientists, doctors and medical professionals who have worked so tirelessly for the past 18 months so that we can start to imagine a return to gathering safely in person in the year to come.

In the March-April bulletin, I answered a few questions from Maureen Chapman, our Executive Director, as a means of introducing myself, and it felt fitting that I would answer a few more questions in this bulletin before Danny and I arrive to Andover in just a few weeks' time.

Maureen: What made you want to become a rabbi? When and how did you know that was the path for you?

Rabbi Chaiken: Naturally, I have answered this question differently at different times throughout my life. As a teenager I started to consider the rabbinate, but later, during my undergraduate experience I thought I would become a lawyer. I studied economics and public policy, and I even prepared for and took the LSAT in preparation for law school. But just as I was preparing to work for a few years before applying to graduate school, the great recession of 2008-2009 was beginning, and the first jobs I found out of college were in Jewish education—teaching Hebrew, music, and more in several communities in the Boston area. During those years, living in the natural rhythm of Jewish time, I found a well of excitement and passion for serving my Jewish community. It was through teaching, and singing, then, that I felt a sense of being called to continued service to our people and our tradition in the rabbinate.

Maureen: Do you have a favorite character in the Torah? Who and why?

Rabbi Chaiken: It's hard to choose just one! So many of our biblical ancestors are compelling precisely because of their humanity—because they are not perfect, and because in both their mistakes, and their triumphs, we see a reflection of ourselves, our history, and our values. My Hebrew name Moshe Yonah gives me a special place in my heart for the prophets Moses and Jonah. Both are classically reluctant prophets, afraid of their own connection with the divine, and the struggle to find their way, but eventually find some measure of success. I am also drawn to many of the matriarchs in our Tanakh, whose lives and voices are sometimes muffled or muted, but who remind us that there are always more stories and perspectives to be revealed from the text.

Maureen: Tell us about your approach to prayer – what makes prayer meaningful for you?

Rabbi Chaiken: For me, there are many different aspects that can make prayer meaningful. Music was one of the first ways I connected with prayer, so that's often where I start. But it's important to me that the words and the prayers themselves have meaning, so I like to include poetry and meaningful translation when I pray and lead prayer too. I believe that regardless of how one feels about God, prayer can be an opportunity to practice gratitude, and focus our thoughts and minds on the kind of world we want to help create. Prayer can be a dialogue with the Divine, but it can also be a vehicle for reminding us of all the ways that we want to change our lives and the values we want to bring to others.

Maureen: What do you see as the greatest challenge facing the Jewish people today?

Rabbi Chaiken: We are living through a time of incredible change in the Jewish world, and the world at large. This unquestionably brings great challenges, and questions. What will our Jewish institutions look like as we start to gather in person again? What lessons will we learn, cherish, and hold onto from this time of pandemic? What are we eager to let go of? But the flip side of "challenge", for me, is "opportunity". Just as the challenges are great, so too are the opportunities we have in this moment: to reimagine the kind of Jewish life we want to live, and to work together to create it for our families, for our synagogue community, and for generations to come. To rise up to this moment, we will need to think expansively and creatively. We will need to listen to one another, and across differences within our Jewish world. We will need to empower one another to be preservers and translators of our sacred tradition. And we will need to remember, as our sages taught in Pirkei Avot, that "it is not our duty to finish the work, but neither are we free to neglect it". (Pirkei Avot 2:16)

Maureen: During the congregational meeting in February, you were asked about your vision for the congregation, and what you hope your community will look like. Can you share about that again?

Rabbi Chaiken: I love imagining the kind of community we can build together. I hope, and I pray, that together we will foster a community where our children grow to love being Jewish and feel connected and inspired by Judaism; where people of all ages, backgrounds, and identities feel welcome and empowered to bring Judaism to life; where we know that the sacred teachings of our tradition are not static on a page, but belong on the path of our lives as we pursue holiness and meaning. I pray that our congregation will continue to be a source of connection to one another, to our ancestors, and to our descendants. I want our community to be a place where we can learn, pray, grow, and sing as a Jewish people, and where we celebrate and comfort one another during all the joys and "oys" of our lives. I strive to foster a community where we are courageous enough to question our beliefs, and simultaneously confident enough to share them, knowing that Judaism and the Jewish people have something to offer the world at large. And while all of this may be quite a lofty vision, each aspect of it represents something we can build and work for together.

I hope that these questions have continued to help you get to know me a bit better!

I look forward to meeting you all very soon, and I wish you joy, safety, and health until then!
