Hashiveinu Adonai Eleicha, v'nashuva; chadesh yameinu k'kedem.

Return us, Adonai, to You, and we shall return; renew our days as days of old! (Lamentations 5:21)

A longing to return echoes through the centuries, from our ancestors' yearning for a return to Jerusalem in the wake of tragedy, to our own yearnings today. The verse above, "hashiveinu, return us" closes the book of Lamentations, which we read each summer as we mark the 9th of Av, a day of Jewish communal mourning; a day that gives voice and memory to the darkest moments in our history. Yet the text also presents a central theme for us to contemplate as we move from Tisha B'Av into our High Holy Days. Rosh Hashanah, our Jewish New Year, and Yom Kippur, our Day of Atonement, are a time to focus on *Teshuvah*. The word is often translated as repentance, but more literally connotes a sense of "return." When we make *teshuvah*, we are seeking to return to the best of ourselves; to return to a sense of closeness with the Divine Presence in the world; to return our actions in alignment with our ideals.

Conveniently, we need not wait until this season to recall this verse. You might recognize these words from the end of every Torah service. Each time

we return the Torah to the ark, we sing this verse to remind each of us that now is always the time to return our lives to a path guided by, and inspired by, the values of our Torah. As long as there is breath within our lungs, we have the capacity to find connection to the Source of Life, and to learn from the wisdom of our sacred teachings.

But of course, this year, this verse takes on new meaning for me, and perhaps for you too. As we approach our High Holy Day season, we anticipate a chance to return, quite literally, after over a year of keeping safer apart, practicing social distance, and navigating life in the time of pandemic. We are indeed returning this year.

While we will continue to be attentive to ongoing guidance from state and federal health officials, we are planning our return to gathering physically in our home here at Temple Emanuel. We are eager to return to the myriad opportunities to connect and be present with one another during life's greatest joys and deepest sorrows. And we are praying that our days will be renewed for life this year; that we will all be sealed for good health and longevity in the Book of Life.

But I must admit, I haven't always been so sure of the last phrase in the verse: "*chadesh yameinu k'kedem, renew our days as days of old.*" After all, *renewal* implies an openness to change and growth, not a commitment to make things exactly as they once were. "Renewing" our days, to some extent, means that they will *not* be like what came before – they will be different, even as they may help us reflect upon and recall our past.

So as we enter this season of return, of *teshuvah*, and we seek to "renew our days as days of old," I want to challenge us to embrace the tension in this expression. Let us renew our commitment to our Temple Emanuel community. Let us fondly recall the "days of old," even as we seek to build something new together. Let us

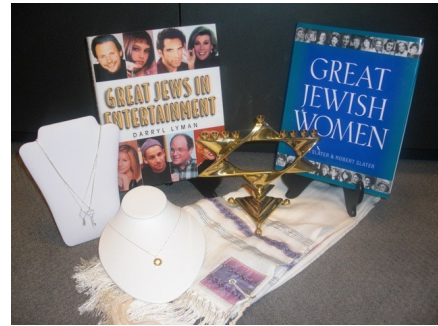

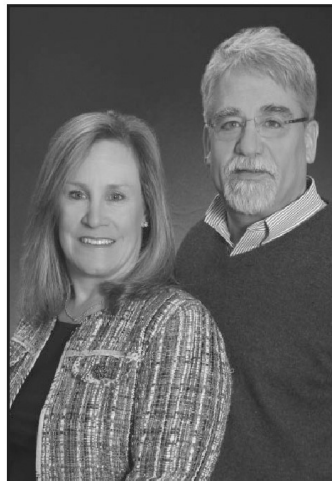
