Facility Updates from House Committee Chair

Now that we are back to being in-person in our building for many events and services you may notice a few changes happening inside and outside of the building. The House Committee has been hard at work bringing much needed updates from the planning stages to implementation.

The first thing you will notice is the big blue wall in our lobby. That wall has been prepared for the installation of our 100th Anniversary Campaign for the Generations donor wall, containing the names of our gracious donors which will forever commemorate the generosity of our congregants.

You will see new blues, whites, grays and beiges begin to appear throughout our facility, and they will help tie together the many spaces that we utilize frequently in a cohesive modern approach.

Other changes that you will notice immediately include the relocation of the Holocaust Torah case that was previously in the lobby into the Sanctuary. You will also see new chairs on our Bimah which replaced the old maroon velour chairs.

We have also added 300 new banquet chairs for our Social Hall. These chairs are part of a full makeover of the space thanks to a donation made specifically for that purpose. Our old chairs have been donated to Free Christian Church. This summer, new lighting, window shades and carpet will also be added to complete the room.

The next time you visit the main office suite you may notice some changes that have taken place. We have installed new carpet, and reconfigured some of the office spaces to bring all office personnel into one area. We will be updating the furniture in the months to come as well as some other much needed improvements. Over the summer the office of the Cantor will be updated as well.

Some other miscellaneous items to note:

- Our Preschool has added a new fence to their outdoor classroom space to provide a safe and secure environment for the children while still providing all of the benefits of being outdoors through a grant.
- We recently were awarded a \$25,000 security grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. These funds will be utilized to upgrade several areas and different equipment in our facility.
- Our new Garden Group has already had several volunteers and if you would like to help us out, please let me know at nealroberts@gmail.com. We will be holding our first meeting on site later in May.

The ongoing maintenance needs of our facility are many, and we have plans to address them the best that we can as our funding will allow. We have recently replaced our sprinkler system's compressor, reinstalled our broken accessibility control at the main entrance and we have passed our recent inspection of our safety systems.

The House Committee is very committed to seeing these projects through and making sure that our building continues to be a safe, warm, welcoming and modern facility for all.

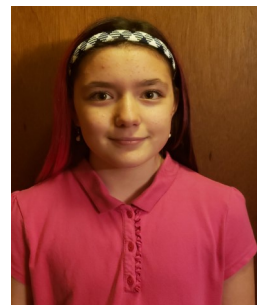

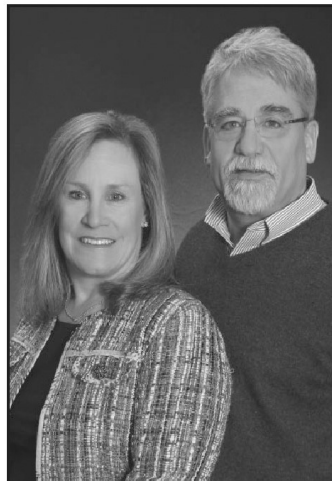
