

# Cantor's Column

#### **God's Song**

Jewish tradition teaches us that in the month of Elul, the month prior to the High Holy Days, we should spend some time reflecting back on the previous year. It is also a chance to find more meaning in our lives going forward into the New Year.

In looking for words of wisdom to share with you for the coming New Year, I turned to "Jewels of Elul", a website that posts an annual compilation of essays written by inspiring thinkers in preparation for the New Year. I read one in particular that spoke to me and gave me inspiration. I was not surprised that I found commonality in this particular person's story. It was written by Cantor Ellen Dreskin, who was the director of the Cantorial Certification program at HUC that I graduated from in 2016. I can best describe her as the "mama bear", head cheerleader and guiding light of our program. She is an insightful leader, an inspiring teacher and a spiritually uplifting Cantor. You will all have a chance to meet Cantor Dreskin, learn from her and be inspired by her the weekend of October 28th-29th, as she comes to Temple Emanuel for my official installation as your Cantor.

This was her "Jewel of Elul" for the 28th day of Elul in 5765/2005: Midrash tells us that our name, Yisrael, when vocalized differently, can become "Yashir Eil" – "God will sing." We are God's song in this world. Full of potential for harmony – tension, joy, sorrow, anger, comfort, pain, and majesty – God sings through each of us. Elul is the time to focus and question: what God song will be heard through my life in the coming year? Chasidic wisdom likens each of us to a shofar. Were it not for the breath of God blowing through me, I would make no sound at all. Elul is the time to tune up, sharpen our skills, and be a song that is worthy of being heard.

The shofar is narrow at the beginning and wide at the end. May we remember to begin with ourselves, and then open our hearts and our ears and our eyes to understand that we too can be bigger – we can be wider – and our smallest actions can make a huge difference in the world.

"Yashir Eil." Be the song; make it good. Awaken others – with your voice and your gifts and your actions – to sing out also, and give honor to the Composer of it all."

As we enter into the days before Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, we take a moment to reflect on our past year. What was good? What was a challenge? Can we recall the blessings this past year has brought us and learn from the challenges we faced? Can we make changes that make our life and the lives of those around us better? What actions

can we take to make a positive difference in our homes, in the world, in our community, in our congregation?

These last few years, the Temple Emanuel community and the Merrimack Valley Jewish community have been going through many changes and transitions.

Change is difficult; it can be stressful. We all recognize and acknowledge that. However with change and transition comes an opportunity for growth and for renewal. Change can be a positive thing, if we all work together in the New Year to make that happen. What can each of us do to ensure positive change and growth in our congregation in the coming year? What gifts can you share with our Temple family to make a positive impact?

As we hear the Shofar blow and usher in the year 5783, how do we live up to being "Yashir Eil"-God's song? May each of us find the wisdom we seek and the strength and conviction to forge ahead, making this coming year everything we hope and dream it can be, for ourselves and for our community.



Our committee is excited to partner with the Temple's Religious School to promote social justice monthly during the academic year working with the 9th grade confirmation class.

The Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism (RAC) launched its 2022 Every Voice, Every Vote campaign, a nonpartisan initiative to strengthen democracy by encouraging and protecting voter participation. "The strength of our democracy rests on the notion that voters pick their leaders -- our leaders do not get to pick their voters," said Rabbi Jonah Dov Pesner, director of the RAC. "Every issue of importance to our Movement is on the ballot this year. We know the best way to combat white supremacy, antisemitism and attacks on bodily autonomy is by having a diverse, invested electorate. Those who show up as voters will help shape what is possible (and what is a priority) for Congress and state legislatures across the country."

With guidance from **the RAC Campaign** & the local chapter of **Indivisible**, the committee held its first postcard-writing party seeking to:

- Empower local communities to drive voter mobilization
- Remove barriers and obstacles to help enable people and communities to access voting resources and support
- Strengthen our democracy by ensuring the electorate reflects the population that it serves.

Those who participated found it highly-rewarding and the next postcard writing party will likely be held some time in September.
