Some of you may have recently seen or read about a new AI – or Artificial Intelligence software that is currently beta testing for free online. You can ask the software to “explain thermodynamics to a 5th grade student” or “write a poem about silence.” It turns out, you can even ask the artificial intelligence software at chat.openai.com to “**write an article for a monthly synagogue bulletin about the importance of community.**” When I recently did this for fun, the “bot” generated a shockingly relevant and well-constructed essay which began as follows:

“In today’s world, it can be easy to feel isolated and alone. We are often so busy with our own lives and responsibilities that we may forget the importance of being part of a community. But the truth is that we all need a sense of belonging and connection to others in order to thrive.

As Jews, we are part of a rich and ancient community with a shared history and heritage. By coming together as a community, we are able to celebrate our traditions, support each other, and learn from one another. In the words of the Talmud, “All Jews are responsible for one another.” This means that we have a responsibility to support and care for each other, and to be there for each other in times of need. When we are part of a community, we are never truly alone.”

As impressive as it is that artificial intelligence software can write this kind of “article,” fear not. I won’t be relying on it for sermons, bulletin articles, or anything but entertainment any time soon. Sure, a computer can learn to generically quote “the Talmud,” (even though it didn’t (yet) cite the specific source from tractate Shevuot 39A) and a computer can scour the internet to put together words that do indeed ring true about “the importance of

being part of a community” and our “shared history and heritage.” But it takes *real human beings* and *personal interaction* to do the actual work that the artificial intelligence describes. It takes each of us coming together to form something greater than ourselves, and as we enter

2023, I am as excited as ever about the ways we can continue doing just that as a Temple Emanuel community.

Throughout our Chanukah season, we came together to dispel darkness—we did so with a huge community celebration, with public candle lightings, and with festive services. We’ve been trying new things, including our Shabbat Morning service community branching out to focus our attention on words of Torah in December, and we’ll be piloting another such study at the end of January. And we have so much more to look forward to as we turn the page to a new secular year.

Starting later this month, I’ll be teaching a class called “Economic Ethics, Values, and Judaism” which I hope you’ll register and join us for. You can read more about it in this bulletin. We’ll be continuing to create vibrant worship with our Soul Sisters, our new House Band, and many special moments to celebrate. We’re participating in a series of programs called Courageous Conversations to address recent issues of antisemitism, and later in January I will be honored to preach at South Church on Sunday, January 29 during our annual pulpit exchange.

With all that’s going on, we hope you will stay engaged or get re-connected! There are so many opportunities to participate and help lead this diverse and vibrant congregation, and we know that while a computer may be able to learn to write words that “sound” like a bulletin article, the humanity and personal relationships we build between one another are what sustain and strengthen Temple Emanuel.

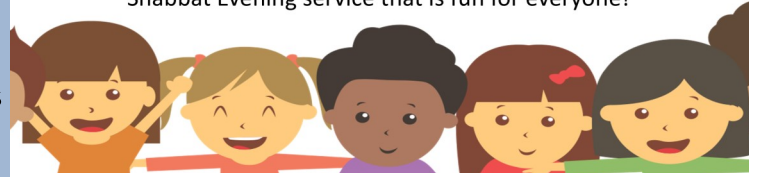

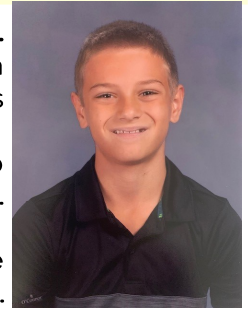

Once again it is time to assign dates for our B'nai Mitzvah students.

We make available a limited number of Saturday afternoon Mincha/Havdalah services as alternatives to the traditional Saturday morning service. Requests for these services must be made at the time of assigning dates, as our clergy and congregational calendars rely on the timing of our services many months ahead. Depending on the number of requests we receive for the afternoon services, we hold a lottery to determine the families who will have their simcha at that time.

These are not assigned on a first-come first-served basis.

If you have a child enrolled in our 4th or 5th grade whose name does not appear on this list, and who does not already have a date for their B'nai Mitzvah, please make sure to inform Elissa as soon as possible, and no later than January 27th.

As a reminder, you must be a Temple Emanuel member in good standing and your child MUST be a registered in our Religious School at this time in order to be eligible for us to assign a date for their B'nai Mitzvah.

Full Steam Ahead will begin at noon. There will be Religious School in the afternoon.

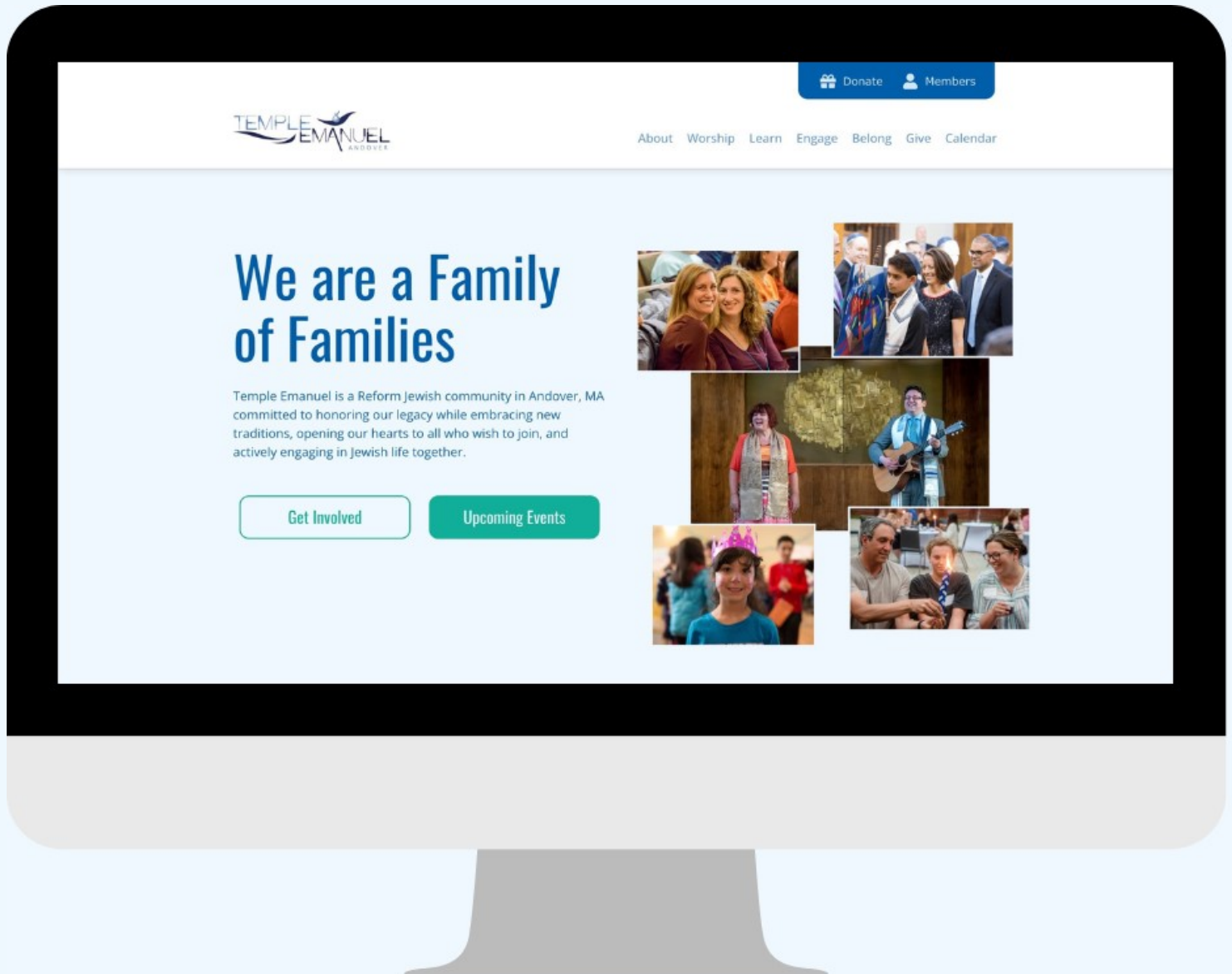
If the weather becomes inclement during the day and we close the Temple and Schools, you will receive an email.

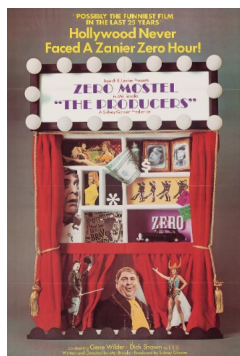

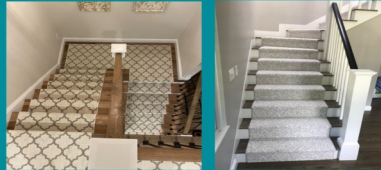
