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### WELCOME

Dear Temple Emanuel community,

We look forward to welcoming the Jewish New Year 5784 with you in a few short weeks! This year, Rosh Hashanah begins Friday night, September 15, and continues through Sunday, September 17. Yom Kippur begins at sundown with Kol Nidrei on Sunday evening, September 24, and concludes with sundown and breaking fast on Monday, September 25.



As always, our services will combine the familiar with the new. We will honor our traditions connecting us to our ancestors, while looking with hope toward our future as we turn the corner into a new year. Our worship will be conducted once again this year by our clergy team, Rabbi Max Chaiken and Cantor Rachel Reef-Simpson, alongside a dynamic team of talented, professional and volunteer musicians from our community.

We are excited to continue getting to know our new High Holy Day siddur, *Mishkan HaNefesh*. As you might remember, we introduced it last year following a multi-year process initiated by Rabbi Emeritus Robert S. Goldstein, along with our Ritual Committee Chair, Dr. Sam Gerber. *Mishkan HaNefesh* is the Reform Movement's machzor (prayer book) for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. If you would like to learn more about the prayer book in advance of the holidays, please reach out to Rabbi Chaiken who will happily meet to discuss it or provide materials to peruse at your own convenience.

We are proud to share that our sanctuary's video infrastructure is undergoing a major upgrade. This improvement will enhance the at-home experience year round and improve the worship experience for those praying in our sanctuary. To that end, this year again, most of our vibrant services will be accessible in person and online so you can join from anywhere.

Finally, you will notice that after extensive deliberation by our lay leadership, we will be gathering in worship as one community on the mornings of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, as well as during Kol Nidrei. There is a short article addressing this in further detail included in this brochure.

### **Selichot Dinner, Film Screening and Service**

Join our Temple Emanuel community and clergy to begin the High Holy Day season with Selichot, a traditional night of introspection and prayer. In partnership with the Larry Hodes Movie and Deli series, we will be screening "Road to Eden." This feature-length documentary film captures the inspirational journey of Dan Nichols, a tour de force of modern Jewish music, who took his show on the road for the Jewish fall harvest festival of Sukkot in October 2011. Dan and his incredible band, Eighteen, loaded into an RV and wandered through the Deep South.

This time of year is about getting out, stretching ourselves, opening up to new places, people and ideas. This is the story of what happened when one artist with a message of love and hope embraced Judaism's profound message: we are all traveling together on a road to a better future, a time when the Earth can become a true Eden for all humankind. As we start our High Holy Day season with Selichot, we remember that the time is now, and our mission, should we choose to accept it, is to get up, get out and make it happen. ### **Rosh Hashanah Potluck Lunch and Tashlich**

Spend the first afternoon of the new year with us as we gather together to enjoy a potluck lunch followed by Tashlich. Tashlich is our annual chance to symbolically cast off our misdeeds as we seek a fresh start for our Jewish new year. This short service includes the ancient ritual and gives us a meaningful opportunity to gather outdoors as the new year begins and we reflect on ways to let go of what holds us back and improve ourselves. ### **Children's Programs**

### **Services for Families with Young Children**

Join Rabbi Max Chaiken and Cantor Rachel Reef-Simpson for a family service on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur afternoons designed for young children and their adults. These special services will be available both in person and online and will include singing, movement, storytelling, learning and listening to the sound of the Shofar.

### **Yom Kippur Healing Service**

Yom Kippur is a time to discover the places of brokenness in our lives and find healing and hope through reflection and prayer. Join us for this short service of song, poetry and prayer. This creative liturgy will help restore the sense of balance and wholeness we seek.

We continue our tradition of inviting a member of our community to share a profound, transformative and personal experience. Temple member Laurie Schwartz will give our Jonah presentation and share her story of choosing Judaism – a lifelong story of seeking her own path, spirituality and personal renewal.

### POLICIES & GENERAL INFORMATION

#### **Tickets**

Your Temple Emanuel membership includes High Holy Day tickets for adult members and unmarried children age 30 and under. Tickets will be mailed to all members in good standing by September 10. Members must be in good standing in order to receive tickets or to purchase tickets for your guests. To be considered in good standing, all past years' dues and fees must be paid in full and the first payment for the current fiscal year must be paid by September 5. If the timeline for payments is a concern and/or you need to request a confidential adjustment to your membership dues, please contact our Executive Director, Maureen Chapman, at mchapman@templeemanuel.net. All adjustments must be made by September 5, prior to the start of the High Holy Days.

#### **Online Access**

Links to Zoom services will be emailed to Temple members in good standing five days before the service starts and again approximately 24 hours before the start of the service. If you can't find the link, please contact us at 978-470-1356.

#### **Tickets for Members' Guests**

Our members are welcome to purchase tickets for their guests to join us for the High Holy Days. To purchase guest tickets for onsite or online ticket-required services, complete the order form on page 10 or on our website at www.templeemanuel.net/HHD-5784 by September 5. Guest tickets are \$180 per person for in-person services for guests over the age of 18 and \$180 per household for online access. The cost of guest tickets will be applied toward dues for attendees who become a temple member during the fiscal year.

### Praying as One: "Hear O Israel, Adonai is our God, Adonai is One"

For centuries, our people have prayed these words describing the most basic principle of our faith: that God is one. As V'ahavta continues, we learn that we show our love for the One by fulfilling the covenant made with our ancestors to live our lives with holiness, and in fulfillment of mitzvot. This year, we will have the chance to gather as one Temple Emanuel community to ring in the Jewish New Year, once again affirming our commitment to our congregational community and to the covenant between God and our ancestors at Sinai.

Throughout the past year, leaders on our Ritual Committee, our Executive Committee, and our Board of Governors discussed and debated the structure and timing of our High Holy Day worship services for this new year, 5784. Ultimately, the Board decided to hold one sitting for worship on the mornings of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, as well as during Kol Nidrei, as the schedule on page 4 indicates. A number of considerations contributed to this decision. We know many in our community will continue to join us online, as they chose to do last year. We also know that even in the years prior to the pandemic, there were questions about whether it was necessary to hold two sittings for those times where we expect the broadest possible participation from our community. Most importantly, our decision was guided by our core goal to create a sense of unity amidst our temple community. We hope this will add to the majesty of the holidays as we ring in a new year together.

### YIZKOR BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

Four times each year, our tradition teaches us to pause and remember loved ones whom death has taken from us, recently or in years long past. The cycles of one year to the next remind us of the passage of time and the passing of life itself.

One way of connecting to deceased loved ones at this sacred time of year dates back to the early thirteenth century, in which some Jewish communities published a Book of Remembrance during the High Holy Day season. Continuing this time-honored tradition, each year for Yom Kippur, Temple Emanuel publishes a Book of Remembrance, which includes Yizkor liturgy, as well as the names of your loved ones. We invite you to send in the name(s) of those family members whom you wish to remember and honor this year.

Similarly, giving tzedakah has long served as a time-honored way to ensure that loved ones' legacies live on. Your generosity at this season and throughout the year helps ensure that the vibrant, dynamic Judaism our ancestors bequeathed to us lives on for the next generation.

### YOM KIPPUR FOOD DRIVE

Each year, Temple Emanuel hosts a Yom Kippur Food Drive in the spirit of *tikkun olam*. At the height of the pandemic, our community raised \$18,000 to feed our food-insecure neighbors. Prior to the pandemic, we collected 4,000 pounds of non-perishable foods, paper goods and household supplies.

This year we're offering a hybrid approach for your convenience. Donate money on our website at www.templeemanuel.net/HHD-5784 or bring a bag of non-perishable food and paper goods to the temple on Yom Kippur.

Paper bags to fill with non-perishable foods, paper goods and household supplies will be available in the lobby at Rosh Hashanah. Suggested donations include coffee, tea, sugar, sweetener, mustard, ketchup, canned vegetables, tomato sauce, soup, napkins, paper towels, toothpaste, soap and dishwashing liquid. A friendly reminder that diet products, expired and opened packages of food will be thrown out. Please, no glass! We will deliver the bags to the Bread & Roses food pantry in Lawrence. Thanks for your continued support.
