Plans are underway to continue to offer spiritually moving and hauntingly beautiful High Holy Day music. I am proud that our core group of gifted singers and talented instrumentalists will be back for the 5786 New Year!

You won't want to miss this year's Cantor's Coffee House with Jacob's Ladder, an internationally touring Jewish Bluegrass band. I saw Jacob's Ladder perform at the Songleader Boot Camp Jewish music conference in February and, they are mesmerizing. They are described as "pushing the boundaries of contemporary Jewish music and traditional American Roots music through Jewish communal singing and prayer. They tell their story through Eastern European Ashkenazic and Sephardic Jewish traditions, but also through their American heritage and its influence on their unique musical style." I am



# SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

**Building Local Interfaith Alliances:** Andover's Fifth Annual Juneteenth Block Party style celebration on Central Street was a great success. Working together again on the planning committee with members of the Andover Baptist Church, Christ Church, South Church, Andover DEI Commission, and Merrimack Valley Black and Brown Voices continues to build bridges within the community. The theme of "Freedom of Expression: Honoring our past, Living in our present, Shaping our future" said it all. There was fun for all ages with food trucks, face painting, a bouncy house and workshops!

**The Religious Action Center of Massachusetts:** Our congregation was represented on RAC-MA's Campaign Committee to determine next year's overarching social justice theme. #### Together, We Made a Difference


In addition to annual membership dues, Temple Emanuel's financial health is sustained by many sources including your contributions to the temple's operating and discretionary funds; gifts toward Tree of Life inscriptions, yahrzeit plaques and High Holy Day prayer book bookplates; Bulletin advertising; donations to special projects that meet the temple's needs; and fundraising efforts by our Sisterhood, Brotherhood, Summer Outing Committee and Development Committee. Together, we have an impact on daily life at our temple while we continue to build a strong and secure foundation for our future.


Gifts at every level had an impact. They supported:

- Our incomparable clergy and inspirational services
- Festive congregational Shabbat dinners, onegs and holiday celebrations
- Programming for all ages—from enriching adult education classes to engaging youth activities
- Enhanced security measures, ensuring a safe environment for all
- Improvements to our indoor and outdoor spaces, making them more welcoming and accessible
- Social justice experiences and social action initiatives, helping us give back to the broader community
- · Vibrant music programs that uplift and inspire us

#### **Fundraising Highlights**

Our Benefactors Society has experienced remarkable growth due to the extraordinary response from thoughtful and generous congregants who chose to become Benefactors with contributions above their regular dues. As of May 30, 2025 revenue from Benefactors, which helps bridge the gap between dues and operating expenses, increased 37% over last fiscal year. A total of 88 Benefactors—including 26 who joined for the first time—contributed an additional \$74,000 to the bottom line of our annual operating budget. Notably, since re-launching the program in 2023, we've grown the number of congregants participating in the Benefactors Society by 166% with corresponding revenue growth of 126%.





Additionally, gifts toward yahrzeit plaques and Tree of Life inscriptions increased by 45% and almost 400% respectively, demonstrating the variety of ways our congregants chose to honor loved ones and acknowledge life cycle events by showing their commitment to our temple.

- Partners with the Social Responsibility Committee to promote a positive culture and support the broader community.
- Grants scholarships for our youth to participate in summer camp and our high school congregants to travel to Israel.
- Hosts regular social seniors' groups.
- Contributes to Temple operations, Religious School programs, and building improvements.
- Spearheads various donation and collection drives, such as the Youth, Education and Special Projects (YES) fund, Pampers for Purim, and Feminine Products for Shelters.
